## DEFENDANT'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR A MODIFICATION OF THE BRIEFING SCHEDULE

Defendant, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC"), by and through undersigned counsel, moves pursuant to Federal Rule of Civil Procedure 6(b)(1) for a modification of the briefing schedule.

As grounds for this motion, Defendant states as follows:

1. On February 15, 2022, the Court entered a Minute Order, providing in part:

Upon consideration of the parties' [38] Joint Status Report, Defendant shall file its Motion for Summary Judgment by May 2, 2022; Plaintiff shall file his Opposition and Cross Motion for Summary Judgment by June 13, 2022; Defendant shall file its Reply and Opposition by July 15, 2022; and Plaintiff shall file his Reply by August 15, 2022.

- 2. The undersigned needs additional time to confer with agency counsel, to finalize the draft, and to obtain supervisory review.
- 3. This relatively brief delay is not unreasonable under the circumstances and will not unduly prejudice the Plaintiff.

- 4. In accordance with Local Civil Rule 7(m), undersigned counsel conferred *via* email with Plaintiff's Counsel, C. Peter Sorenson, Esquire about this modification. Mr. Sorenson consents to this modified schedule:
  - a. Defendant shall file its response on or before May 9, 2022;
  - b. Plaintiff shall file his opposition to FERC's motion for summary judgment and his cross-motion for summary judgment on or before June 13, 2022;
  - c. Defendant shall file its reply brief and its response to Plaintiff's cross-motion for summary judgment on or before July 6, 2022; and
  - d. Plaintiff shall file his reply brief on or before August 8, 2022.
  - 5. This is Defendant's first request for an enlargement of time.
  - 6. A proposed order is attached.
