# DEFENDANT'S UNOPPOSED MOTION FOR <u>A MODIFICATION OF THE BRIEFING SCHEDULE</u>

Defendant, the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission ("FERC"), by and through

2. Subsequently, on May 2, 2022, the Court granted Defendant's unopposed motion

for extension of time and in a Minute Order directed that:

Defendant's Motion for Summary Judgment is due on May 9, 2022; Plaintiff's Opposition and Cross Motion for Summary Judgment are due on June 13, 2022; Defendant's Reply and Opposition are due on July 6, 2022; and Plaintiff's Reply is due on August 8, 2022.
